1.4.2 Feedback Analysis and Action Taken Report of the University on feedback report 2021-22

The Feedback Analysis Committee of the institution designs and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and curriculum related issues. The feedback forms were collected from students, teachers, employers, alumni and professionals. Students who offered feedback were from different constituent colleges of MGUMST.

The feedback targets following different content for different stakeholders.

- For students, it addressed curriculum and its learning related issues in terms of quality, competence, skills and professionalism. This feedback also considers other issues like delivery of curriculum by teachers.
- For teachers, the feedback addressed issues like suitability the course and its need base, outcomes of the curriculum, relationship with course content and corresponding reference material, availability of reference materials in terms with curriculum, evaluation methods and curriculum delivery, etc.
- For employers, it addressed issues like general communication skills, developing solutions to real life problems, working in a team, creative challenges to challenges, organization skills, learning of new techniques, integration of technology for work as learnt through the curriculum.
- For alumni, it aimed for responses on adequateness of courses curriculum, sufficiency of syllabus content in context of current professional standards and curriculum design in context of development of self-directed learning and problem-solving approach.
- For professionals, it targeted issues like necessity of additions and deletions in the curriculum in connection with theory and practical parts of the syllabus. The responses were also taken from them about the weightage of the syllabus in terms of marks distribution.

The feedback collected is analysed and sent to the respective authorities for the actions.

I: Feedback from Students:

The analysis of the students' feedback clearly depicts that they are well satisfied with the curriculum development and revision. Still some improvements were suggested in teaching learning process.

Students Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

The Feedback Analysis Committee of the institution designs and collects feedback from its stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and curriculum related issues. The feedback forms were collected from students on several aspects of curriculum and its learning related issues in terms of quality, competence, skills and professionalism. This feedback also considers other issues like delivery of curriculum by teachers.

The report of feedback analysis is submitted to Vice Chancellor/Pro-Vice Chancellor of the University than the feedback report was forwarded to IQAC for necessary action and thereafter the analysis is shared with all constituent colleges, heads and they are instructed to take necessary measures and actions as to comply with the issues raised by the learners.

Out of total 552 responses, almost 97.5% students are satisfied with the depth of the syllabus. 96.5% believed that syllabus covered all aspects of curriculum including communication skills. 95.8% rated learning skills (in terms of Practical, Communication, Team work, Leadership, Research) as very good. 38.4 percent found learning values in terms of attitude, ethics and broadening perspective as very good. 38% rated availability of practical facilities as very good. 41.6% percent rated availability of clinical facilities as very good. 93.9 percent were satisfied with library reading room facility. 44.7% rated content and conduct of various internal examinations as very good. 37.5 % rated the feedback system related to performance in internal examinations as very good. 48% found hostel facility as very good felt the need for updating of syllabus. 29.6 % opined on extracurricular activities as very good. Overall academic response was found to be very good by 35% of respondents. 51.9 % respondents graded infrastructure facility of classrooms with computers and projectors as excellent. 58.3% respondents appreciated uninterrupted power supply, (42.6%) reading material in library (43.5%) common rooms. Overall 38.9 % rating was found to be excellent.

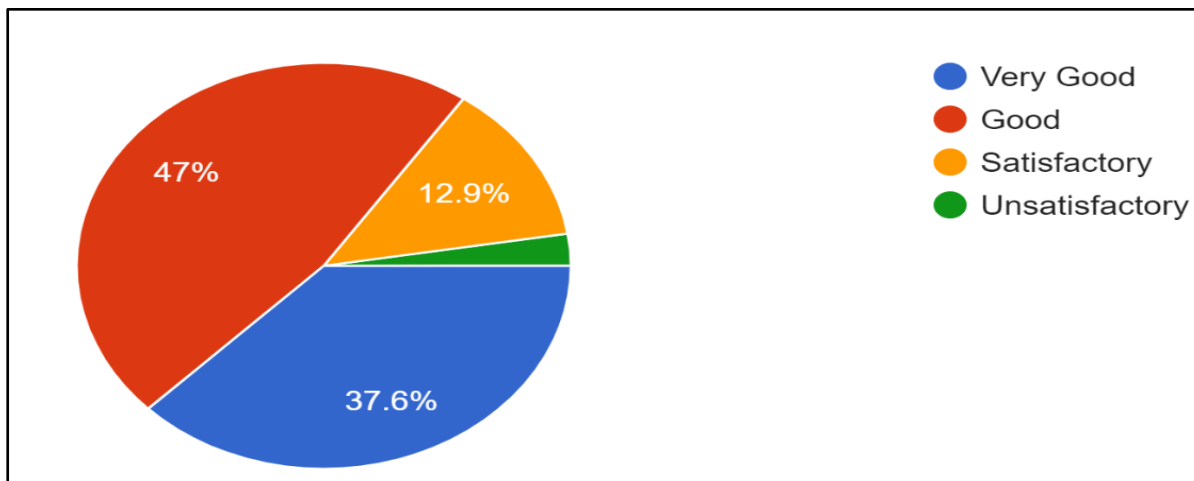

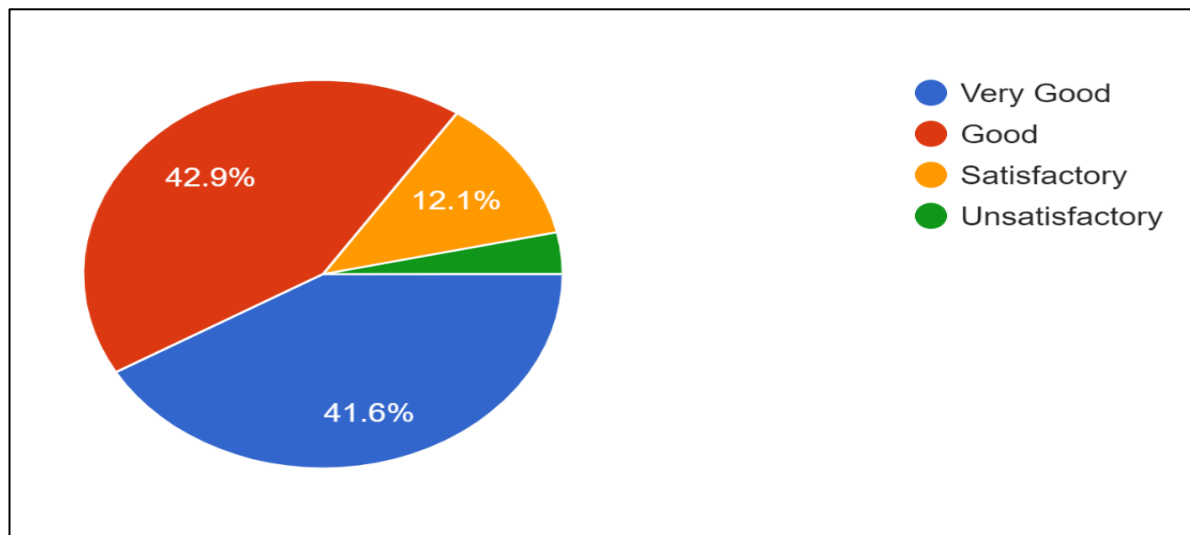
6. Adequacy of available practical facilities in terms of curriculum.

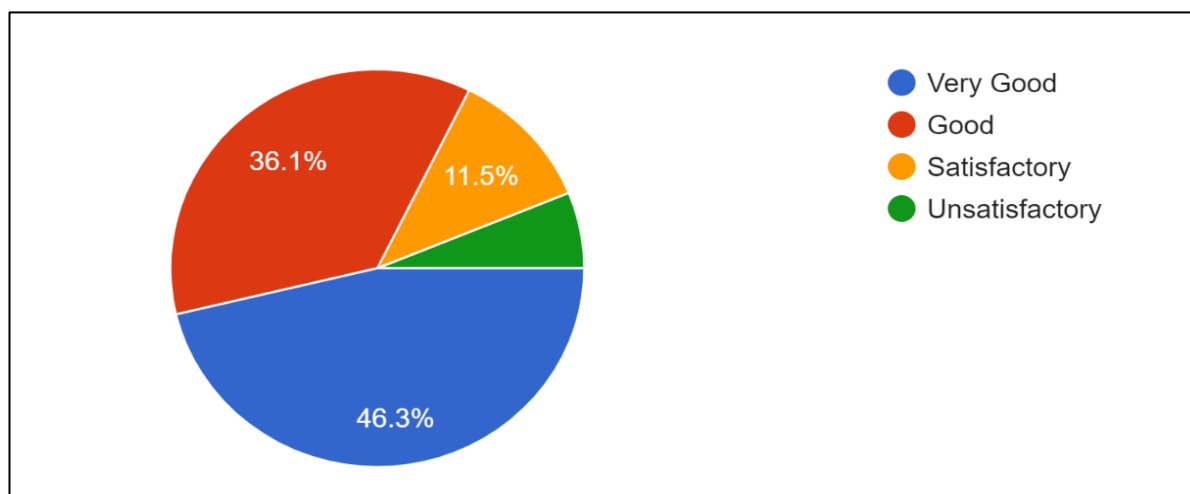
7. Adequacy of available clinical facilities in terms of curriculum

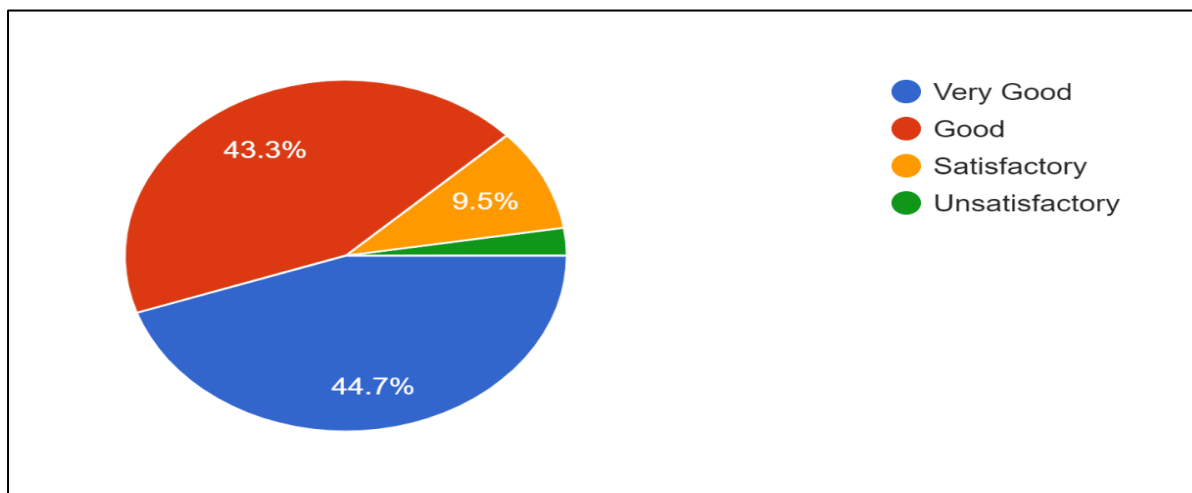
8. Relevance and adequacy of available Library books and resource material in terms of curriculum.

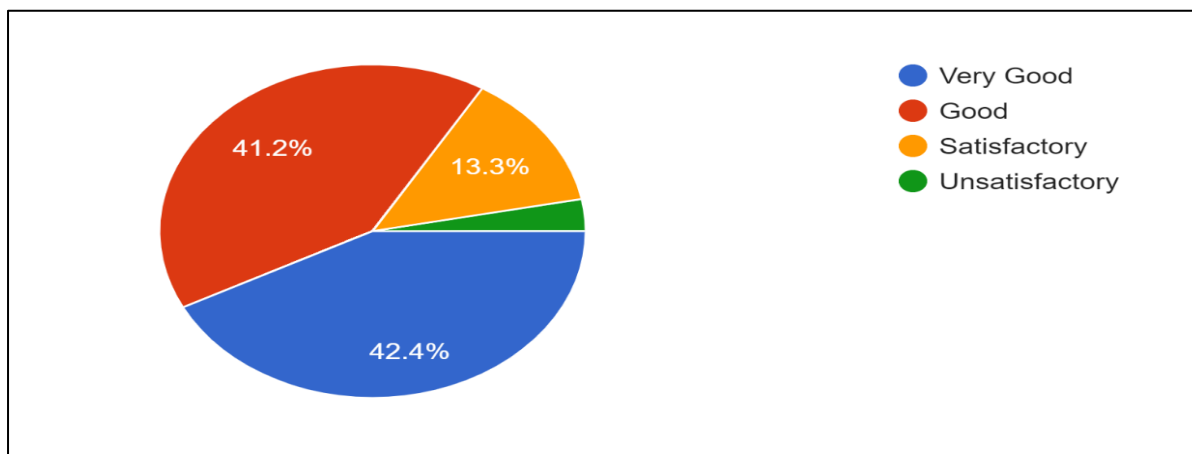
9. How will you rate your University theory exam paper content with respect to curriculum coverage.

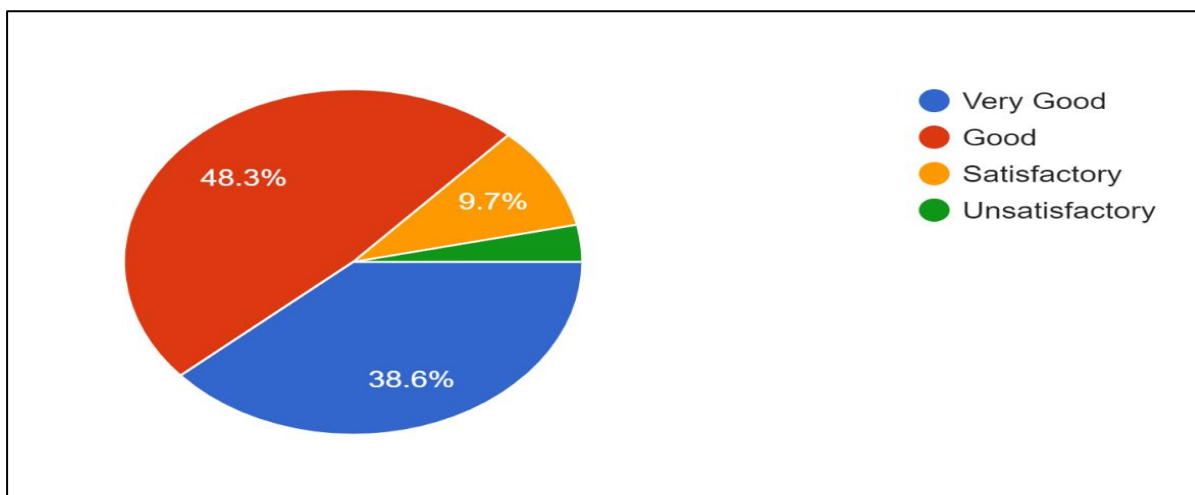
10. How will you rate your University practical exam content and conduct with respect to curriculum coverage.

Faculty (Teacher) Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

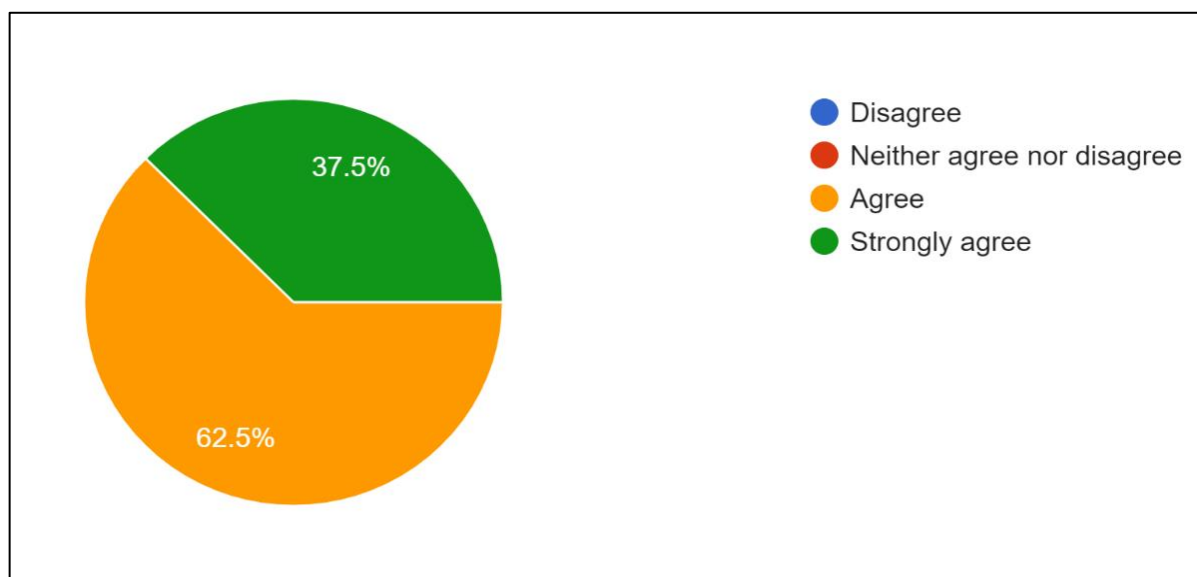
100 % of the faculty were satisfied with syllabus being suitable to the course and need based. 96.5% found objectives were clearly defined. Assessment was well correlated with syllabus and teaching learning methods. Freedom to adapt to newer strategies of teaching was found with 98.3 percent. 85.7 percent found relevant books in the library. 71.4 percent agreed that infrastructural facilities are sufficient. 78.6 percent found canteen and other facilities as appropriate. 98.2 percent respondents felt tests and exams are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus. 91% found departmental environment conducive to teaching and research. 82.3 percent felt university administration as teacher friendly. 91 % agreed that the University provides adequate and smooth support for projects and research facilities. It was found vertical and horizontal communication was appropriate. 87.3 percent faculty were satisfied with fair and non-discriminatory provisions for professional development.

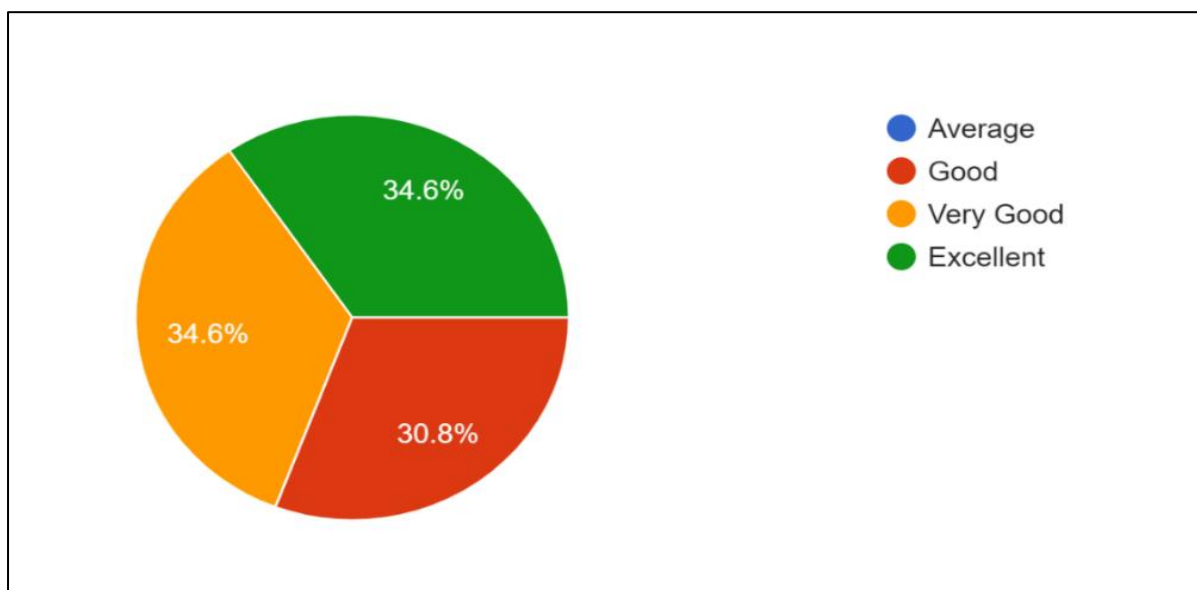
Alumni Feedback Analysis Report 2021-22

Sufficiency of syllabus content in context of development of technical skills was graded excellent by 34.6% alumni. 30.8% considered syllabus content suitable in context of current professional standards. Competence and support offered by teachers during the course was graded as excellent by 34.6% of alumni. Library, Internet, Laboratory and equipment facilities offered by institute was rated by 23.1 % as excellent. Overall Learning Experience in terms of relevance to real time experience was rated by 30.8% as the best. 30.8 % rated Institute's support & contribution for overall development of students as excellent. Training and placement offered by institute was rated excellent by 20 percent of alumni. Suggestions to improve the evidence-based practice, practical demonstrations, home assignments with appreciation for pharmacology department was noted.

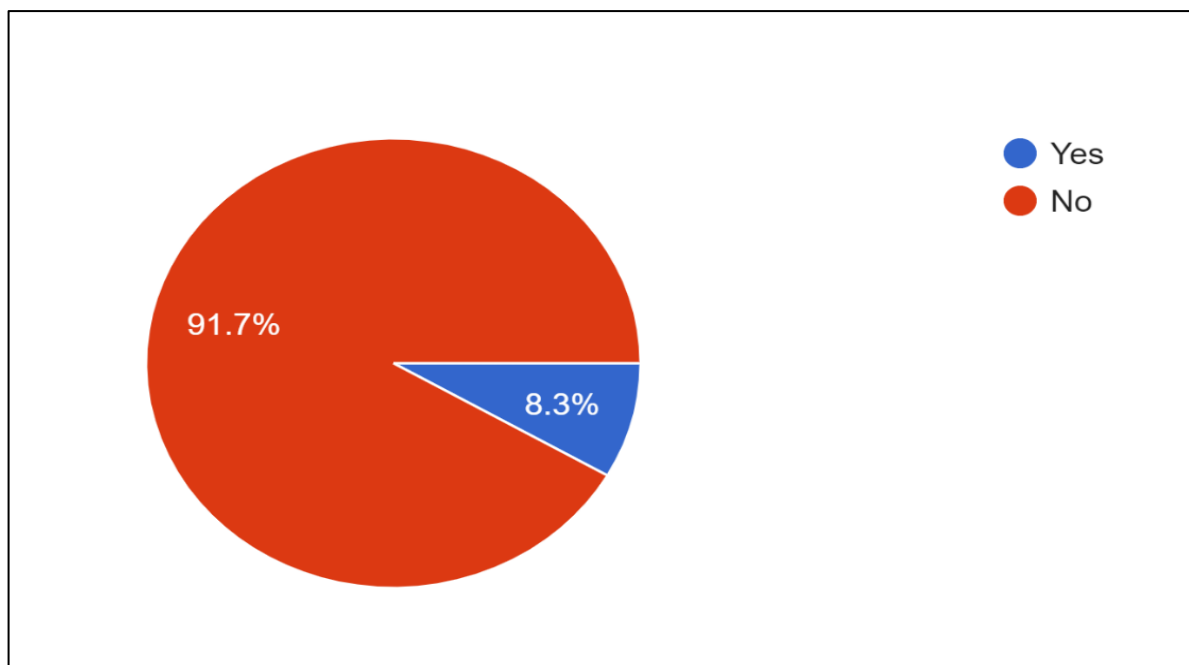
91.7% of responses opined that curriculum design and development for theory and practical was satisfactory. No change in theory syllabus was needed with suggestions to include recent advancements in the respective fields. Practical syllabus (72.7 %) was found to be adequate with suggestions for rural postings and deletion of animal experiments from PG syllabus. 50% rated student performance in practical's and 33.3% in viva and 54.5% in theory as very good. The consensus on overall exam conduction and arrangement for students was found to be very good.

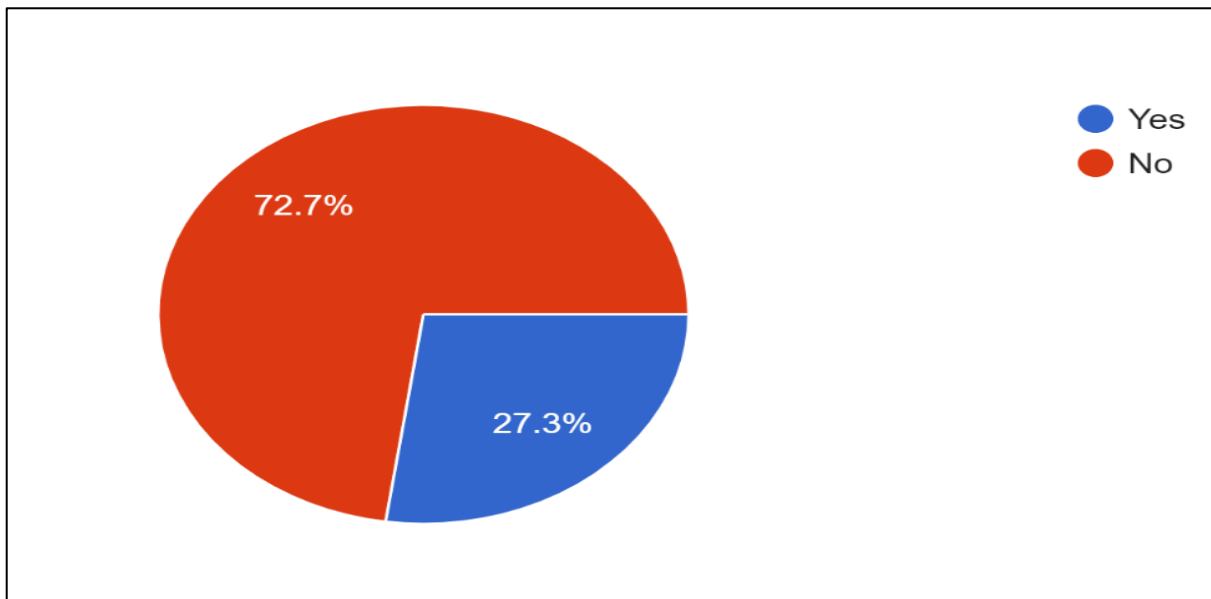

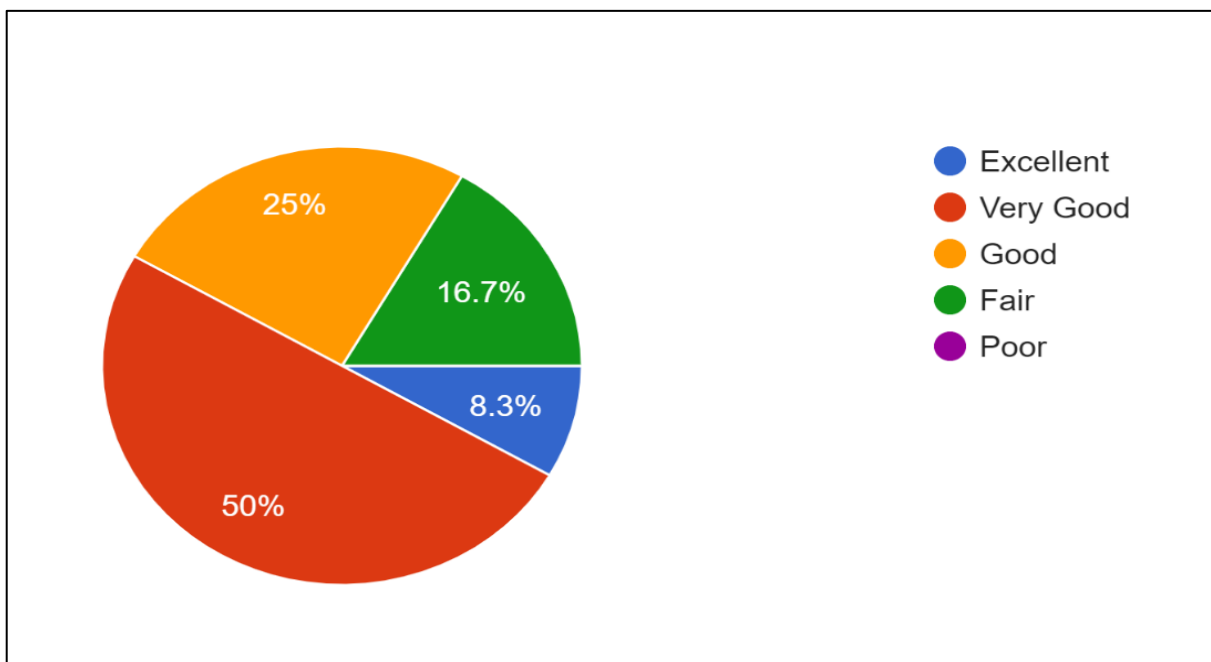

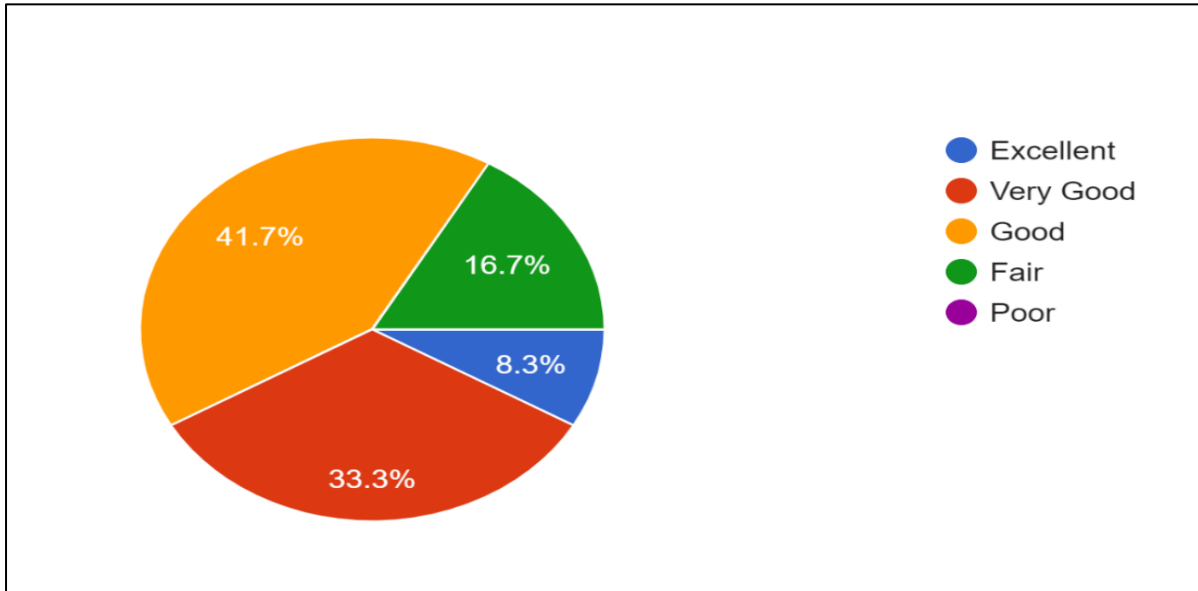
